She Loves Me, She Loves Me Not: The Early Quest to Belong

Marianne Robinson, PhD, presenter

Dr. Robinson will explore the building blocks and dynamics in the Mother/Baby Partnership. This synchronicity we call 'fit' is an important and potentially life-giving achievement that requires complex contributions from each partner. The baby's early experience of fit reverberates throughout life in ways that become evident in later intimate relationships. Dr. Robinson will outline the role of such experiences as they accumulate to build an internal world in the baby and growing child. She will offer examples from infant observation and from infantile states in adult treatment to illustrate theory and invite dialogue from the audience.

Marianne Robinson, PhD, MSW, FIPA, has been in clinical practice for over 30 years. She is a Training and Supervising Psychoanalyst and founding member of the Northwestern Psychoanalytic Society. She is also a full member of the Psychoanalytic Center of California. She is in private practice in Seattle and has teaching and supervising commitments in Alaska. As a faculty member of COR Northwest Family Development Center she has taught infant observation for over ten years. She is also a Certified Group Psychotherapist. Her thinking is compatible with that of Bion, Klein and Meltzer, and with many of those who continue to develop their ideas. Her research and writing focus on the potential for growth that can be realized when investigating, understanding and analyzing the vestiges of early trauma.
